Boundary Remembers

On 11th November, each pupil from Boundary Primary School made and planted their poppy in the school Remembrance Garden. On each poppy they had written the name of a soldier who had died in the First World War. Afterwards, the school took part in a service where the pupils remembered these soldiers and



others who have sacrificed their lives in past and present conflicts. The service was led by Year 6 and Jenny from the Church Army was also present. During the week, the pupils had further opportunities to reflect as they took part in a whole school art week based around the theme of poppies, using different techniques, such as collage, print and sketching.

This half-term has been full of exciting activities, trips and learning within our PE lessons and our competition timetable! We have taken part in various competitions and festivals at Blackpool Sports Centre, Stanley Park aswell as football fixtures against other schools. Towards the start of half-term we visited Blackpool Sports Centre to take a group of keen Year 2 children to practice and develop their netball skills!



We took part in Year 3/4 Indoor Athletics, and came 4th from 8 which helped us qualify for the school finals in January, and our Year 5/6 team finished 5th, narrowly missing out on a qualification spot. Boundary Switch-off Week 2023

During this half-term, we have been busy taking part in the energy saving campaign "Switch Off Fortnight".

The children will take part, with other schools from around the UK, and will aim to make small changes in their lives that save energy and help protect the planet. It is a fun and rewarding campaign led by Boundary Primary School's Eco Warriors and will bring Cop 28 to life for our pupils.

Switching off lights when we are not in the room, turning off interactive screens when not in use and ensuring fewer electrical items are turned off

at the plug socket, and not just on standby, are the main issues we are tackling in school now and for the year.



Forest School

Year 1 and Year 6 had a wonderful time during their Forest School session. They were not put off by the rain and explored the mud kitchen, played some games, hunted for autumn leaves and listened to a story.

Year 1 Church Visit

Year 1 visited St Mark's Church where they met Reverend Matthew and told him everything that they



have learnt about Christianity so far. Reverend Matthew then read the nativity story and they all joined in with different parts. He taught them about the key messages in the story and the roles of different characters. They then learnt about the advent wreath and the symbolism of the different candles. Finally, they looked around the church and asked and answered lots of questions about features of the church.

PSCO Visit

Debby Savage, a local PSCO, delivered a 2-hour talk to Year 6 about the dangers of drugs and alcohol. The children had the chance to look at imitation drugs to know what they look like so that they know to avoid

them as they get older - they were shocked to learn that some drugs can be disguised as sweets! She also told them the dangers of smoking and vaping. We learned that cigarettes are made up of lots of different parts - many of which can be very dangerous, such as ammonia, glycerin and candle wax.



Year 2 Fire Fighters

Year 2 had a very special visit from 3 firefighters from the Blackpool Fire Station near Stanley Park. The 3 firefighters talked to the children all about fire safety and what to do in the event of being in a fire themselves.



They showed us all their different equipment that helps keep them safe when they are working. We learnt so much including: how to test if the fire is close to a closed door, how to stop smoke leaking into the room we are in

and taught us to remember 3 very important stages: **Get out**, **Stay out and call 999**.



<u> Anti-bullying Week 2023</u>

We have been learning about Anti-Bullying this half-term. We launched the week with a whole school assembly where we explored



what bullying is, the different types of bullying and how we could reach out and help others. Everyone was invited to wear odd socks to celebrate differences and diversity. Our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors talked about their role in school and explained how they are there to help people if they have a problem or worry.

Throughout the week all classes have explored different themes around anti-bullying including celebrating people's differences, exploring different types of bullying, looking at the different roles within groups and stereotyping and prejudice.








Tower of Support
