
Road Safety Week

Digital Literacy in Year 5

Pupils in year 5 have taken the next step in their computer coding journey. With thanks to Micro:bit Educational Foundation BBC and Nominet's 'BBC microbit – the next gen campaign' - we have received a free class set of Micro:bit computers to support our computing curriculum and develop the pupils' digital literacy.

Pupils wrote code to make a game on the Micro:bit. The code used the accelerometer and LED display to allow users to play Rock, scissors, paper by shaking it in their hand.
