Anti-Bullying Week

During November, we participated in Anti-Bullying week.

We began with a whole school assembly based around the theme 'Choose Respect'.

Throughout the week

the children learned about being respectful and why this is such an important skill for life.

Alongside this they also explored the theme of bullying including what it means, different types of bullying, what to do if you are being bullied, the differences between a bystander and upstander, how to solve conflicts and what discrimination means.

The week concluded with an 'Odd Socks Day' to celebrate everyone's differences and promote kindness.

Year 5 African Drumming



Earlier on in the half term, pupils in Year 5 had an amazing opportunity to take part in an African drumming workshop.

Pupils learned about the different percussion instruments from West Africa and had a go at playing a djembe - an African drum. They learned different dances and rhythms which they then performed in an assembly at the end of the day to parents and carers.

On Monday 11th November, each pupil made a poppy to plant in our school Remembrance Garden.

Upon each poppy was the name of a soldier who gave their life in the First World War.



Following this, the whole school took part in a Remembrance Service led by Year & and Reverend Captain Matt Rowley. The service was an opportunity to remember these soldiers and others who have sacrificed their lives in past and present conflicts.

The pupils also had further opportunities to reflect as they created pieces of art based



around the theme of poppies. A range of techniques were used across school including collage, clay work, printing and sketching.
