We shared an assembly focusing on how to be a responsible passenger, a responsible road user (on a bicycle


or scooter), how to be responsible near a road as well as our responsibilities when crossing a road. All classes then dedicated a PSHE lesson to Road Safety.

Tuesday 11th February saw us celebrate Safer Internet Day. The theme this year was "Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online". This is important as over


one million people in the UK were tricked by online scams last year. As a school, we discussed what this means in a whole school assembly before going on to complete age appropriate activities.
