Nursery Activities Week Beginning 23rd March

Monday 23 rd March	How many numerals from 1 - 10 can you recognise? Match the correct number of objects to the numeral e.g. numeral 4 match with 4 cars. You can find number cards in your home learning pack.
Tuesday 24 th March	Practice writing your name. You could make a rainbow name by doing each letter in different colours.
Wednesday 25 th March	Go for a shape hunt around your home. What shapes can you find? Draw some of the shapes you find.
Thursday 26 th March	Watch "We're Going On A Bear Hunt" together https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OgyI6ykDwds Draw a story map to show the families journey.
Friday 27 th March	Share the Nursery Rhyme "Humpty Dumpty" together. Can you draw humpty sat on a wall? (resources in your home learning pack)

Other Activity ideas for you to enjoy together.

Play a game with your family.	Make a healthy snack with a grown up. Draw a picture.	Draw or paint a self-portrait.	Find 3 items of different lengths. Can you put them in order from the longest to the shortest?	Can you spot signs of Spring in the garden. Are leaves beginning to grow?
Get some pegs and blankets and make a den! Share a story and a snack in your cosy den.	Use old boxes to create models - the bigger the better!	Put some music on and dance!	Have a competition with your grown up! Using Lego, duplo, building blocks or old boxes - who can build the tallest tower?	Create a potion in the garden using mud, leaves, petals and sticks.
Draw a picture of your favourite animal.	Design your own Superhero cape.	Make a picnic and eat it in the garden.	Dress up in fancy dress clothes and tell a story.	Look for bugs in the garden.
Play Eye Spy.	Sing some Nursery rhymes together.	Paint or draw a picture of anything you like.	Collect some objects that are special to you. Put them in a box.	Draw a picture of your family.
Do 20 star jumps.	Make an obstacle course outside.	Read a story outside on a blanket.	Practise writing your name.	Talk about The Easter story with your family.

1. Sharing Stories

Sharing stories with your child is an important part of their development. It supports their communication and language skills, develops their imagination and encourages them to think about why things are happening. Try to share a story every day and ask your child questions about the story. "What happened when?" "How did...?" "Why did...?" "How did they feel?" "What else could have happened?"

2. Play Together

Children learn a lot through their play and if you play with them you can support their learning. Talk through activities with them, talk about your ideas, extend their ideas, ask questions, model language and set them challenges. They love it when you do something wrong and they have to correct you! Use bricks and Lego to build, count and look at shape, small figures to make up stories, get creative and make pictures and models together, explore mark making with sticks and mud in the garden, on large paper or even in a small tray of sugar or salt. Embrace your inner child and get playing!
