Write a list of 5 different habitats and which animals you may find there. You could draw it if you like.
<b>Art Collage</b>	Create a collage of your favourite animal.	Create a collage of the planet.	Create an Easter card for your family.	Design an Easter egg.
<b>PE</b>	Do 25 star jumps - increase by 5 star jumps each day. What's your record? Keep a chart/table of how you do from Monday to Friday.	Jog on the spot for a minute. Rest for twenty seconds. Jog on the spot for two minutes. Rest for twenty seconds. Jog on the spot for three minutes. Check your heartbeat - how many heartbeats per minute can you count? Rest for two minutes.	Do a go-noodle dance.	Get moving with BBC super movers
<b>PHSE</b>	If you have a pet, clean out their cage/bed, feed them and brush their coat/fur.	Make up a new game to play with someone in your house. Teach them the game and then play it together.	Play a board game with your family.	Help someone in your house with some household chores, like hoovering, dusting, folding the clean washing, or making a bed.
<b>Extra phonics / spelling</b>	Write the days of the week. Extra challenge- can you write each of the day into a sentence?	Can you write numbers one to twenty in words?
