AFTERNOON ACTIVITIES

Use one of the links on the following page to find out some interesting facts, write these in your workbook. Can you illustrate your facts too?	Draw/sketch an object from around your house. Can you research different shading techniques and use them in your sketch?	Look after, water and care for a plant in your house. Take pictures of how it changes over time and send them to you SeeSaw account.	Create your own comic strip character. Make up your superhero. What would be his/her special powers? Who would be its arch enemy? Draw a weekly comic strip of your character's latest adventure and share them on SeeSaw.	
Continue to READ, READ, READ! Write a book review and share it with someone in your family. Can you persuade them to read a book you have already finished?	Teach someone in your household how to: To multiply any 3 digit number by a one digit number.	Interview a relative/member of your family at your house or over the phone. Ask them five questions. What can you find out about them that you don't already know?	Find out about the lifecycle of a frog and a ladybird. What are the similarities and differences? Can you draw the lifecycle of each one?	Do 25 star jumps - increase by 5 star jumps each day. What's your record? Keep a chart/table of how you do from Monday to Friday.
Sketch a still life. Collect a few objects from around your home (fruit, bottles etc.) and sketch them. Research different shading techniques and use them to shade your picture.	Create a game on Scratch (see link on next page), can a family member complete your game?	Teach someone in your household how to: -Add together two 5-digit numbers -Subtract two five digit numbers -Multiply a 4-digit number by a 1-digit number -Divide a 4-digit number by a 1-digit number	Design and cook a two-course meal for your family, with the help of an adult in your house.	Design a new Easter egg. Think about: Type of chocolate, name of your Easter egg, style, colour, lettering and pictures on the box containing your Easter egg.
Challenge a member of your household to a 'Hit the Button' duel. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button	Using a pack of cards, learn a new game with a member of your family. If you are on your own, find the rules for Solitaire and learn how to play that.	Write diary of your time at home. Remember the diary features that we learned about in our Reading into Writing lessons.	If you have a pet, clean out their cage/bed, feed them and brush their coat/fur.	Make up a new game to play with someone in your house. Teach them the game and then play it together.
Watch a movie with someone in your family and talk about what happens in the story at the end. Come up with your own ending to the story.	Teach someone in your house about conjunctions and what they do. Make up silly sentences adding in a choice of various conjunctions. Have a competition of whose is the silliest.	Help someone in your house with some household chores, like Hoovering, dusting, folding the washing.	Draw a portrait of someone in your household. If you have paint, can you paint it?	Bake some cakes/biscuits with an adult in your house. Do a 'Bake Off' taste test.
