Play a game with your family.	Make a healthy snack with a grown up. Draw a picture of it and label it	Draw an object found in your house. Can you colour it in?	Find three objects of different size and put them in order of length or height.	Can you spot signs of Spring in the garden. Are leaves beginning to grow?
Collect natural objects from the garden eg. leaves. Can you make a picture?	Go on a shape hunt around your house. What shapes can you find?	Find different objects and weigh them. Which is heaviest and lightest?	Look for patterns around the house eg. patterns on socks or curtains etc.	Make a pattern using objects from around the house.
Draw a picture of your favourite animal and label it.	Design your own Superhero.	Make a picnic and eat it in the garden.	Dress up in fancy clothes and tell a story.	Look for bugs in the garden.

Reading Books

Sharing stories with your child is an important part of their development. It supports their communication and language skills, develops their imagination and encourages them to think about why things are happening. Try to share a story every day and ask your child questions about the story. "What happened when?" "How did...?" "Why did...?" "How did they feel?" "What else could have happened?"

Reading is a key basic skill and all children should be reading age appropriate book three times per week. In order to ensure your child keeps making progress with their reading whilst not attending school, we need you to ensure they read regularly

Children learn a lot through their play and if you play with them you can support their learning. Talk through activities with them, talk about your ideas, extend their ideas, ask questions, model language and set them challenges. They love it when you do something wrong and they have to correct you! Use bricks and Lego to build, count and look at shape, small figures to make up stories, get creative and make pictures and models together, explore mark making with sticks and mud in the garden, on
